Stop & Search. The increase and its benefits.



On the ward team, we are ensuring that stop and searches are being conducted. Officers from Forest Hill, Crofton Park and Perry Vale ensure that the streets are safer by completing stop and searches. Officers are on a mixture of foot patrol and mobile patrols and where grounds exist, we ensure stop and searches are being conducted. Statistically, more arrests happen from Stop and Search than anything we else deal with as the ward team. Police ensure that areas that are reported to us as having an increase of either drug use or crime are patrolled more often and this is where searches are more so performed. Stop and search every year, takes more knives off the streets.

Warrants and the legal bits

Officers can apply to the courts, where intelligence suggests that entering that property will provide evidence to an offence. Police apply for warrants, but these can sometimes take time. As our residents, to help us with this, reporting more online and by calling 101 can contribute to our evidence that we take to the courts. And remember, in an emergency always dial 999.

The best advice we can give our residents is to leave lights on when out, ensure all doors are correctly locked and secured and any and all CCTV is working before leaving your home.
