You Said, We Listened, We Did

Over the past two weeks officers from Perry Vale and Forest Hill SNT have been conducting Traffic Enforcement operations in Manor Mount SE23 in answer to recent complaints from local residents that road users were frequently contravening the 'No Entry' sign at the junction of Honor Oak Road and speeding along Manor Mount. Officers were tasked and attended the area at peak hours during early and late rush hour times to tackle this issue.

A number of vehicles were stopped for contravening the 'No Entry' sign and also for driving the wrong way down a one way street. The drivers were reported for the offences and will receive a fine of £100 and an endorsement of 3 penalty points on their driving licences. The residents of Manor Mount who approached police were very happy with their presence at the location and the actions which had been taken.

Good News Story

On Wednesday 14th January 2015 officers from Forest Hill assisted Perry Vale SNT in executing Drugs Warrant at an address on Dacres Road SE23. Information had been received from members of the public that there was a cannabis factory within Rosemount Point one of the blocks of flats. Upon entering the address a cannabis factory was found with 23 mature plants and also hydroponic equipment which was needed to grow them. The male who was at the address was subsequently arrested and charged for the production of cannabis and abstracting electricity.

Crime Prevention Advice

Over the past 12 weeks Forest Hill ward has suffered an increase in motor vehicle crime offences, mainly theft from motor vehicles and theft of number plates and satellite navigation systems. As a preventative measure, the team advise residents to consider contacting their local Halfords who were giving away free packs of anti theft screws which permanently fix the number plates to their vehicles and also to keep all valuables out of sight when your vehicle is unattended.
